Ralph F. Schettl, age 85, of Oshkosh, died Friday September 27, 2013 at Bethel Home in Oshkosh. He was born in Oshkosh on January 31, 1928 the son of the late Frank and Anna Lemberger Schettl. Ralph served his country during WW II and the Korean War in The U. S. Navy. He married Dorothy Kossl on June 25, 1949. Ralph was employed as a Gas Service technician for forty-two years with Wisconsin Public Service. He enjoyed racing pigeons, and was a member of The Oshkosh Racing Pigeon Club, playing bingo, and taking trips to Oneida.
