Carolyn Met Harrmann Youngwirth, age 91 of Oshkosh, passed away Sunday, February 15,

2015 at Park View Health Center due to kidney failure that stemmed from an eight-year battle with polycystic kidney disease . Being the incredibly resilient woman that she was, Carolyn fought the disease vigorously, but a sudden case of the Influenza A virus weakened her immune system and she was no longer able to compete with these complications. Up until her passing, she was surrounded

by the immense love and support of her family. In memoriam of Carolyn's life, we the family would like to illustrate a personal narrative to show just how special she was, a delicate angel who was very near and dear to our hearts and the hearts of those she touched. Born

January 23, 1924, the daughter of former Oshkosh superintendent Francis X. Greenough and Ema (Wittlief) Greenough, Carolyn enjoyed music and playing piano, reading, dancing, playing bingo, shopping, traveling, and celebrating holidays with her family. She also had a twin sister, Catherine Dean, who was her best friend. After

graduating from Oshkosh High School in 1942, she attended a women's college in Madison, majoring in business. Upon graduation, she worked in Washington D.C. in a secretary pool for the war. She married Louis R. Harrmann on May 18, 1946, who preceded her in death in 1984. She later married Franz Youngwirth in April of 1994, who also preceded her in death in August of 1998. She had five children with Louis, survived
