Arletta L. Schweda-Schulte, passed away on Wednesday, December 19, 2018 at Westbrooke Manor, Oshkosh, 8 days prior to her 98th birthday. She was born in Mauston, WI on December 27, 1920 to the late Arthur and Loretta (Kane) Smith. As a child she moved to Kenosha, before moving to Wisconsin Dells in 1936, returning to Kenosha in 1982. She graduated from Wisconsin Dells High School class of 1939.

On September 13, 1941 she married George Schweda of Wisconsin Dells. He passed away in December of 1974. In November of 1982 she married Paul Schulte of Kenosha. He passed away in November of 2002.

Arletta worked many years at Parson's Trading Post, the Hotel Crandall as a baker, and Camp Wawbeek of the Easter Seal Society. She enjoyed bowling, playing cards, and dominos.

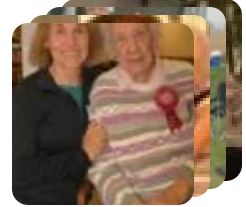
