Love you Dad, you will be missed more than you can believe.

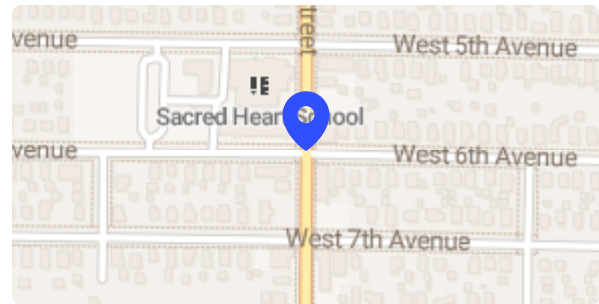

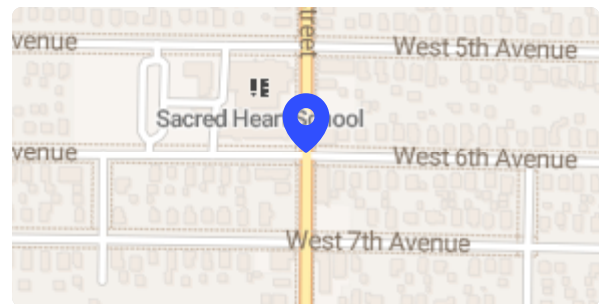
