Judith's family would like to thank her special team of doctors, nurses, caregivers and her amazing friends for all of their support along her.

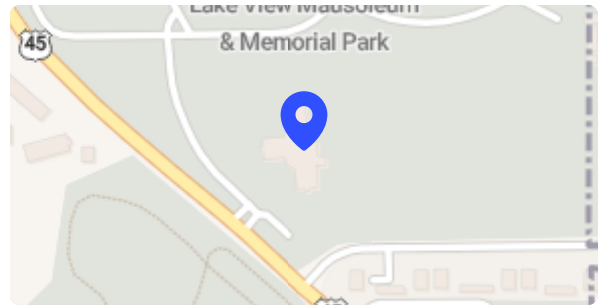

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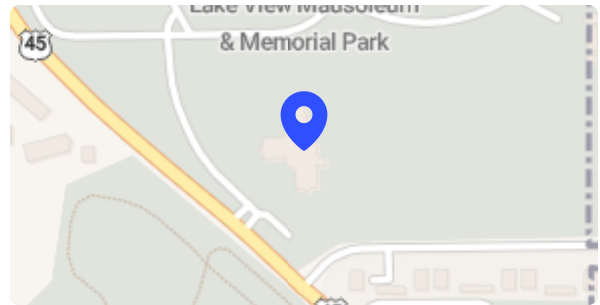

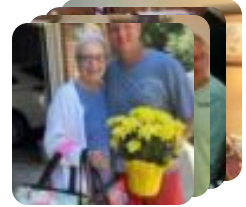
